COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course provides an introduction to the main issues raised by language practices from a sociolinguistic perspective. Students will explore these issues through key concepts such as norms, variations, language contact, language insecurity, linguistic practices and representations. This exploration will be based on case studies, preferably related to current issues in French-speaking contexts in France (newly arrived students, textbooks and school discourse in French as a mother tongue, foreign or second language) and/or abroad (identity constructions, marginalisation, etc.).

OBJECTIVES

The course will raise awareness of the main sociolinguistic research techniques and provide guidelines for linking linguistic variation to language and culture teaching.
