### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course is based on the central concept of cash flow. The analysis of the financial statements made it possible to present the elements allowing to carry out a static analysis of the situation of the enterprise. After a reminder of the main indicators linked to the static analysis, the financial flow analysis course focuses on the dynamic analysis through two approaches. The first is to understand the formation of the cash flow. Indeed, understanding the elements that have influenced the variation of cash flow, allows to better forecast and manage it. It is then possible to look at forecasts, particularly through the establishment of financing plans. The in-depth analysis of profitability is also addressed. The course is completed by a business simulation game.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

At the end of this course, the student should be able to make a detailed analysis of the short, medium and long-term financial situation of the venture and be aware of the importance of cash flow management. Students should also be able to construct financing plans and propose long-term financing solutions.
