COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course allows students to acquire the tools required to succeed and get the most out of their studies at a French university (reading and writing skills at French universities, how to take useful notes, how to write a summary, how to prioritize work and specific tasks, etc.).

OBJECTIVES

Students work on long documents, practice document research and academic methodology.

Depending on their status (exchange or non-exchange) and following assessment, students can obtain 6 or 4 ECTS credits or a certificate of successful completion.

The Fall semester is partly online with students working independently and 3 to 4 face-to-face check-up courses to help students move forward.

During the Spring semester, students work independently on the basis of online materials and there are no face-to-face classes.

PREREQUISITES

Due to its specificity, this class is available only for students with a B2 level in French.

Students must take an online test (test SELF) in order to determine their language skill level.

Please note that this course is subject to a minimum of 8 participants per level.
