UMR ESO participates in the ANR Hilauseniors program (Intermediate Housing - AUtonomy - SENIORS).

ANR Hilauseniors (Habitats Intermédiaires – Logements – AUtonomie – SENIORS - ANR reference: 23-PAVH-0007). Priority Research Program (PPR) on Autonomy (aging and disability).

## Description of the research project in which the research activities entrusted to the officer take place:

You will work on the Hilauseniors project, which brings together the complementary strengths and expertise of 12 scientific partners<sup>1</sup> to provide an interdisciplinary approach to autonomy and housing: design, economics,

epidemiology, occupational therapy, geography, geriatrics, psychology, sociology and urban planning. Led by URV, the consortium involves around 40 researchers.

The project examines how housing and the surrounding environment help maintain autonomy as people age. It asks what intermediate housing (IH) schemes designed for retirees—chiefly senior service residences and "résidences autonomie"—contribute to residents' autonomy compared with ordinary housing (OH). Three surveys form the methodological backbone:

**HILOS survey:** 15,000 seniors aged 75 + followed over five years, questioned three times (every 18 months) on health, sociability and solidarity, reasons for moving into IH, perceptions of senior housing, satisfaction with services, etc.

**FOCUS survey:** in-home interviews with 200 seniors drawn from HILOS in four socio-geographically contrasting areas; each participant will be visited three times.

**OFFRE survey:** questionnaire sent to managers of all senior service residences in France (over 1,000 sites) to collect data on housing features, resident profiles, services/activities and costs, complementing official statistics on "résidences autonomie" and rural retirement homes (Marpa).

The programme is structured into work packages (WP):

**WP0** – Coordination

WP1 – DATA: creation and production of data (running the HILOS, FOCUS and OFFRE surveys)

WP2 – IH supply: territorial location logics, service provision and associated costs

**WP3** – Transitions between housing types: autonomy trajectories and determinants; lived experience of moves (using HILOS & FOCUS)

**WP4** – Autonomy trajectories: how housing type (IH/OH), territorial features and available services shape autonomy over time (linking HILOS panels with OFFRE data)

**WP5** – Autonomy and residential choices: relationship to home, social ties, well-being, sense of "being at home", privacy, decision-making and citizenship dimensions; strategies for staying put and adapting housing in the face of functional/cognitive decline and available formal/informal support.

## **Provisional project schedule:** 5 years

#### **Expected results:**

You will be closely involved in WP5 (Autonomy and residential choices), in conjunction with WP3 and WP4. WP5 focuses on the physical and spatial characteristics of housing and environment as factors that can foster or hinder autonomy and personal fulfilment. Particular attention is paid to residential strategies, (non-)adaptation of housing to ageing-related changes and the mobilisation of formal and informal support.

Key expectations: Carry out FOCUS in-home interviews and conduct the cross-analysis of HILOS (quantitative) and FOCUS (qualitative) data. Produce detailed and summary written and oral reports for project partners and the academic community (conferences, journal articles).

The post-doctoral researcher or research engineer will be attached to ESO in Angers. They will work under the supervision of Annabelle Morel-Brochet (Associate Professor HDR in Geography, co-lead of WP5 and the FOCUS working group) in close collaboration with the ESO team and all project partners.

## Definition of research activities and tasks to be accomplished:

Qualitative fieldwork (FOCUS):

- Help design interview guides and address ethical considerations.
- Identify participants, arrange appointments, conduct in-home interviews (including tests assessing autonomy), analyse and interpret results.
- Fieldwork will require travel to Nord, Pas-de-Calais, Loire-Atlantique and Vendée.

Data analysis: Cross-analyse FOCUS qualitative data with HILOS quantitative data.

Dissemination: Contribute to academic outputs and outreach to a wider audience.

Team support: Assist with coordinating and energising the ESO project team.

Travel to the investigation departments is expected (expenses paid).
